## What a waste of paper!

In a study of various recycling programs by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) it was estimated that 12 to 45% of household waste consisted of mixed paper. Why the range? Basic programs only recycle office paper, envelopes, copy paper, shredded paper, newspaper, magazines, etc. while others go beyond these basics and include corrugated cardboard as well as boxboard (like boxes that hold beverages and other foodstuff). Regardless of the number it is probably the biggest commodity in your weekly trash.

That's right I said commodity. Local drop-off centers sell mixed paper to national firms that turn around and sell this raw material on international markets. The recycled paper stock ends up back in that cereal box. These centers get paid based on the amount of paper, an economy of scale. The more paper means the more money they will receive.

And when I say local I mean within blocks of your

home. For example Pond Spring Elementary School accepts the basics from the community and the proceeds go back into the school's activities program. The Goodwill Blue Hanger location at McNeil and Technology Drive also accepts basic mixed paper from the community. There are probably many more in the area that I didn't happen to take note, but the website earth911.org is a great resource for finding local recycling locations.

The latest and biggest to come into the area would be The City of Austin's Solid Waste Services partnership with H.E.B. at Parmer and McNeil. Our neighborhood H.E.B. is one of only four stores in the Austin to benefit from this collaboration. A couple of months ago, H.E.B. housed green and white painted dumpsters in their parking lot to collect all sorts of mixed paper including boxboard and cardboard. Jennifer Heber, with the City of Austin's Solid Waste Services, said one reason why this location was chosen was to reach residents that don't benefit from the city's curbside recycling program (like small businesses, apartment complexes, or private services that don't include paper recycling in their programs).

Obviously most paper is made from trees and is easily biodegradable. Some paper has plastic finishes, like glossy magazines that makes it harder to break-down. But most modern landfills prohibit photodegradation as they block sunlight. In another report by the EPA, newspapers disposed of in modern landfills were still readable after 30 years.

Next time you run out to get some milk or pick-up the kids, bring along some of that junk mail and see how much paper contributes to your family's garbage versus our community programs.

## KEEP YOUR PLANTS ALIVE Not Thriving!

**Fast Forward---**Even with the heavy rains in May, our plants have been growing fast and look great. However, the bad news is that we must shift our thinking ahead to what an Austin summer yard and lawn needs. So...set your mower as high as possible, mow whenever it needs trimming by 1/3, do not fertilize again until late August, and water deeply whenever you can still see your footprints in the grass after 1/2 hour.

**Unless it rains 1 inch of water every week** on your yard, you **NEED** to water your yard and planting beds to keep the plants alive, (not thriving) through the heat of June, July and August. Watch for wilting and then water in early morning for as long as it takes to get water running off. Wait 20 minutes and water again until runoff. This saturates the soil and produces deep roots. Wait until you see sign of water stress before watering again. If you have good deep soil and deep roots you should be able to only water deeply once a week.

**New grass requires more water** while the roots are growing so water often enough to dampen the

soil to just deeper than the root level. With new seed or sod in full sun, this may be several times per day during a drought with blistering sun and drying wind. Slowly spread out the watering times until October and then just water occasionally for the first winter.

**Mature lawns can be watered weekly** or less often when the roots are well established and the grass is dense and tall enough to shade the roots.

**Do not fertilize grass now**, with a high nitrogen fertilizer, it will cause rapid top growth requiring more water. From August to October, spread 1/2 inch of Dillo dirt or other compost to encourage deep turf and roots.

**When watering, give all plants a long, deep soaking** to encourage a deep root system. To find out how long your watering system takes to output 1 inch of water, put out opened cans around the water sprinklers to measure the length of time it takes to accumulate 1" of water. This time tells you how long to run the sprinklers. Although, if water runs off before this time is up, move to watering another area for an hour or so and return to sprinkle

the area again to complete the full time. The amount of water required by full sun or by shaded areas is greatly different so watch for the wilting and then adjust the length of watering time for each area.

**The best time to water is in the early morning** before dawn which allows the leaves time to dry before the sun scorches them. It also lessens the possibility of fungus that is encouraged by humidity and darkness. Slowly stretch the time between waterings out to once every 5 or 7 days and you will have healthier plants, save water, and comply with the water conservation guidelines.

**Keep a 4" depth of mulch on the planting beds** and around large shrubs and trees to discourage weed growth, help hold in the moisture, and keep the soil and plant roots cooler.

**Other tips for summer:**

**If your grass leaves have turned yellow**, spread chelated iron or iron sulfate.

**Raise the lawnmower blades** as high as you can get them now. Mow often enough so that only 1/3 of the grass blades are cut off. Tall grass develops a deeper, more water efficient root system.

**Remove old flower heads** from all annuals and perennials. This is commonly called dead heading and encourages new blooms.

**Cut the seed heads** off the crape myrtles after they finish blooming in late July to encourage another round of flowers.

**Be sparing with fertilizer on native plants** as they tend to grow rampant and do not bloom as well when over fed.

**Do not fertilize grass now**, it will just grow fast and require more water and mowing.

**Spray crape myrtles** with Cloud Cover or another anti-transpirant to prevent powdery mildew. If the mildew is already present, spray with Benomyl mildew control. Fungus can also be controlled with an application of copper and liquid seaweed, 1 tablespoon to a gallon of water sprayed on the leaves.

**Mealy bugs** are controlled with Safer Insecticidal Soap sprayed three times at 7 day intervals. This also controls aphids, thrips, scale, whitefly, spider mites, and earwigs. **Thrips leave white fluffy** deposits on twigs and the thrips look much like the deposits. They are more of a problem in hot dry

weather.

Use **sun screen** and wear a hat to protect your skin from ultraviolet rays which cause sunburn, premature aging and cancer. **To raise the SPF of your clothing** to SPF30, put all your outdoor clothes in the washer, use the hottest water safe for the fabrics of the clothes, add during the wash cycle a packet of Rit Sun Guard laundry treatment for UV protectant available at the fabric stores with the RIT dye products. It reduces my sun allergy greatly.

**Mow and Mulch:** Sharpen your mower and raise it to the highest setting. Mulch the lawn by returning the clippings back on the grass. Mulching reduces the need for fertilizer and water and inhibits weed growth. Any sharp mower can mulch if your mowing pattern causes clippings to be recut a second time if needed. For the last 18 years I have been mulching grass back into the yard. I spread Dillo dirt or fertilize lightly in May and October, and use no pesticides except Logic in spring and fall and Orthene for spot treatment for the fire ants. The yard looked the best it ever had in '97 when the fall and spring rain made the

difference. We are not lucky this year.

**Newly planted plants** in beds, need extra watering for the first 2 years. Water before stress shows or you may kill the plants and this is false economy. For new plants; 1st week- water every day; 1st month-water 3 times per week. For the following spring through fall-2 times per week; during winter-once per week or as needed.

The goal is to encourage root growth away from the plant so use a leaky hose for watering and cover the soil with 4 inches of mulch to develop healthy plants which will make it through the summer, winter, and look great next year.

**Trees in stress:** show as trees that are receding (not growing leaves to the tips of the branches this year) or with brown leaf tips. Construction damages tree roots by compacting the soil, or scraping off the topsoil, or by putting fill dirt over the roots. Death occurs from 1 to 3 years later. In general to save trees in stress, since the roots are not working well, we must give more water and must get fertilizer to the roots that are left. Put a leaky hose 2/3 the way out the drip line (or farther away for an established tree) and turn on 1/4 turn to slowly let it run for 6 to 8 hours every 10

days (in July and August every 7 days). Water and fertilizer must reach the roots 6 to 8 inches down, and must reach all roots. Tree spikes and top dressing with fertilizer probably is wasted money, (too little area is covered and fertilizer only works when the tree is rapidly growing.) (For live oaks, this is the 140 days February to May).

All our trees need the bark to be protected from lawn mowers and weed eaters and need their roots to be cool and slowly fed. The method recommended by TexaScapes and TreeFolks is to build up a 3 inch deep mulch bed or tree ring. Make it like a donut at least 3 foot wider than the trunk of the tree (this is one of the times when much larger is much better). Use any organic mulch, pine bark, compost, or composted soil mixture like Back to Earth (BTE) composted cotton seed hulls.

**Summer flowers** will take extra care in mulching in and watering until they get roots established. A foliar application sprayed on the leaves with a weak fertilizer or liquid sea weed and fish emulsion mixture will encourage blooming and plant growth. As always, the native plants like the **Salvia Greggii**, **Salvia farinacena** 'Mealy Sage', **Salvia Coccinea**

'Coral Nymph, **verbena**, and **lantanna** need very little fertilizer, can take the heat, will bloom until mid fall, and are perennials and will come back up again next year.

**Small understory trees and shrubs** fill out our landscapes and provide resting and nesting places for birds. These Texas-grown trees and shrubs are adapted to the hot weather. **Desert Willows** (*Chilopsis linearis*) is a full-sun flowering tree. They are a multistory restaurant for hummingbirds. They begin blooming before the crepe Myrtles and bloom until late fall. They require little water plant them in a sunny corner of the fence and they can be planted in summer. **Texas Sages** or *Cenizo* (*Leucophyllum frutescens*) can grow to be a large bush though they take pruning well. Leaves are light gray and blooms are pink to light blue shortly after a rain. Do not over-water they will grow fast and get leggy. Again, 3 of them in a sunny corner of the fence will do great.

**TERMITES**

Subterranean termites are "Kings of the Wood Destructing Insect" pests in the United States. They cause more than \$5 billion in damage each year, more property damage than that caused by fire and windstorm combined. They are social insects that live in nests or colonies in the soil, hence their name "subterranean." Swarming usually occurs from April through July, during the daylight hours, usually after a rain. Environmental factors such as heat, light and moisture trigger the emergence of swarmers. Subterranean termites derive their nutrition from wood and other material containing cellulose. Paper, cotton, burlap or other plant products often are also part of the termite's menu.

Moisture is important to subterranean termites, which have very little resistance to dehydration. To survive, they must maintain contact with the soil (their primary moisture source) or other above-ground moisture sources, such as in structures with defective plumbing or guttering. Their presence is not readily noticed because they hide their activity behind wallboards, siding or wood trim.

**Here are some signs of infestation you should look for: Swarmers:** Generally, the first sign of infestation noticed by homeowners is the presence of swarming reproductives on window sills or near indoor light. Swarmers inside the house nearly always indicate

- One bread bowl hollowed out, with the bread cut for dipping

Combine the whipping cream and cream cheese in a sauce pan and cook on low until the cheese is melted. Add the spinach and artichoke and cook until heated through. Add mozzarella to cheese mixture and stir until melted. Add garlic and salt to taste. Serve warm in the bread bowl.

# Beyond the Recycling Bin

Strategies for decluttering, reusing, and feeling better about yourself

Picture the scene on Trash Day morning, just about every week in the neighborhood. Sitting curbside is all manner of goods keeping company with the regular bagged garbage. Old barbecue grills (beaten up, maybe, but perhaps still capable of firing up a burger or two). Work desks. Chairs. Computers. Bicycles. Recliners. Kids' scooters. Lawn furniture (would a new cushion rehabilitate that chaise?). Even an occasional basketball hoop, fridge or old sofa. All destined for the dump.

What's wrong with this picture? Austinites tend to be progressive, do-it-yourself types, and that includes us suburbanites – even residents of Milwood, Hunters Chase and environs. We like recycling and dislike needless waste, we're open to innovative ideas and ways of doing things, and we like feeling good about being responsible citizens and custodians of our immediate environment. Beyond the weekly bin filled with soda cans, plastic jugs, cardboard boxes and newsprint, there's a world of recycling opportunities open to you, and if you know where to look, those denizens of South and Central Austin will have nothing on you where green consciousness is concerned.

To start with, there's nothing more suburban than the neighborhood garage sale day, and besides putting a few bucks in your pocket, it's all about reusing and repurposing. Note that it usually falls a week before Disposal of Large and Bulky Objects Day. (Clever, eh?) But if you really don't feel like consigning the old grill, spare bed, or obsolete PC to the dump, know that a number of alternatives exist. Take the **Austin Freecycle Network**. This Internet-based group operates on the principle of "if you have an old couch/table/kids' clothes/basketball hoop/tree you don't need, give it to someone who's looking for it" – that is, one person's trash is another's treasure. And every single item "regifted" via a Freecycle group is, by definition, free for the taking. Founded as one local group in Tucson, AZ in 2003, the Freecycle Network now has over six million members worldwide, including over 18,000 just in Austin, at our lively local branch:

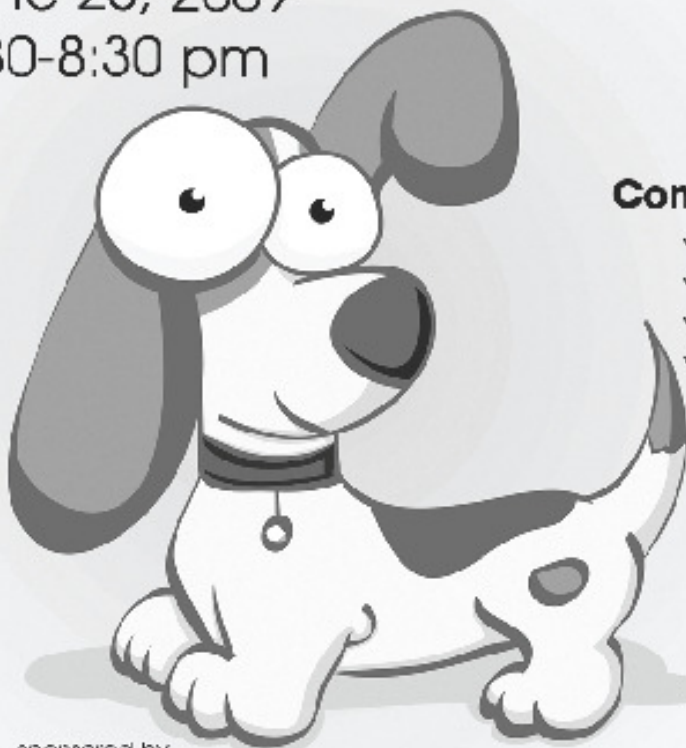

Pool Identification tags and tennis court keys must be purchased through the District Manager

**Pool Rules and Regulations**

**Identification**

1. Pool is available to District residents who have paid tag fees and their guests. Out of District memberships are available. Only individuals with tags may enter pool area.
2. Identification tags must be worn by swimmers at all times.
3. Report lost or stolen I.D. tags to the pool manager. Replacement tags can be purchased through NA MUD 1 / Rattan Creek Pool for a \$10.00 fee.
4. Use of pool I.D. tags by any one other than the swimmer listed on the current year's registration form will lead to forfeiture of that I.D.

**General Requirements and Conduct**

1. Conduct by any person deemed to be dangerous, unwarranted, or offensive is grounds for discipline by the lifeguards. Offensive behavior in particular, will be dealt with on an individual basis and could result in suspension from the pool. Any individual suspended three times may also lose all pool privileges for the season.
2. Running, jumping, skipping, or any activity other than ordinary walking in the pool area is strictly prohibited.
3. Bicycles and skateboards must be walked in front of the pool entrance for safety. No pets are allowed in the fenced pool area.
4. Pool may close for ten (10) minutes each hour as a safety precaution
5. Floating devices are not allowed in the pool. Water wings or swim rings for non-swimming children may be used if accompanied by parent or approved baby-sitter.
6. Glass containers of any type are not allowed inside the fenced area or in the bath house area.
7. No cutoffs or street clothes are allowed in the pool.
8. Only lifeguards are to be on the lifeguard stands.
9. No person shall talk to, shout at, or in any manner distract a lifeguard while on the lifeguard stand except in the case of an emergency.
10. Only masks approved by the Pool Manager will be allowed in the pool.
11. One lane will normally be designated for lap swimming at all times, additional lanes may be added at the discretion of the Pool Manager.
12. No smoking or alcoholic beverages are allowed in the fenced pool area.
13. Coaching activities, other than by parent/guardian, are prohibited except as provided by Pool Manager, McNeil High School or the Hurricane Swim Team.
14. Parents must be within arms reach of non-swimming children at all times.

**Adult Supervision**

1. Children under ten (10) years of age must be accompanied by a parent/guardian or authorized baby-sitter at all times while inside the fenced pool area, unless approved by Pool Manager.
2. Parents are required to provide written authorization naming a specific approved baby-sitter to attend their children under 10 years old at the pool. The baby-sitter must be fourteen (14) years of age or older and be a pool member or have a valid guest pass.
3. Parents must be within arms reach of non-swimming children at all times.

**Guest Policy**

1. Guest(s) must be accompanied by a registered pool member and submit a valid guest pass for admission. Pool members must accept responsibility for their guests.
2. Guest(s) must register with the gate keeper upon admission to the pool facility and sign a waiver of liability.

**Private Parties**

1. Adults eighteen (18) years and older holding a pool I.D. may make reservations to use the pool for a private party when the pool is not open for regular operating hours. All parties must terminate (all participants departing the facility) by 11:30 p.m.
2. Reservations must be made at least four (4) days in advance with the Pool Manager. Reservations are confirmed by a \$50.00 deposit. A reservation is not confirmed until the Pool Manager receives the deposit. The cost for rental of the pool is \$10.00 per hour plus lifeguard fees.
3. Persons responsible for any parties must hire lifeguards. Lifeguards must be those guards that are under contract with the District.
4. Any damages resulting from a private party will be the responsibility of the lessee.

**Wading Pool**

1. Children taller than a height set by the Pool Manager will not be allowed in the wading pool.
2. Lifeguards will not monitor the wading pool. Children in the wading pool must have a parent or baby-sitter present at all times.

**General Information**

1. At the discretion of the Pool Manager and as approved by the District Manager, certain periods of the normal open hours may be set aside for specialized activities such as, adults only swim, swim lessons, swim meets, and other special events.
2. Hours may be shortened before and after school starts, and during swim team season. Check the Pool Bulletin Board for scheduled events and scheduling changes.

**Tennis Court Rules:**( In District Members Only)

Tennis Court Hours 7:00 am – 10:00 pm.

1. By entering the court for play, you are acknowledging that you have read and agree to abide by these rules.
2. Tennis courts for tennis play only. No Soccer tennis.
3. No glass containers or alcoholic beverages permitted on the courts.
4. No pets, bicycles, skateboards, or motorized vehicles allowed on courts.
5. No dangerous or offensive conduct or offensive language will be allowed.
6. Proper tennis attire must be worn at all times. Shirts will be required at all times.
- 7. No tennis lessons allowed.**
8. Gate should be closed and locked at all times.
9. A maximum of (4) players are allowed per tennis court at any time.
10. Application and fee for court keys MUST be paid at NA MUD 1 (Rattan Creek) POOL(separate from water bill). Keys are not available for pick up. Keys will be mailed weekly. Only one key per household will be issued. Absolutely **NO CASH** will be taken at pool.
11. All household members using the courts will need to obtain a tag at the pool. Members should keep tags with them at all times when playing. Members can be required to show tags at anytime.
12. All tennis court reservations will be made by registered tennis members through the online tennis reservation system. Tennis court reservations may be made one week at a time, and not more than 7 days in advance.
13. A maximum of 2 hours per reservation and one reservation per member per day, with a maximum of 4 reservations per week, may be made through the online tennis reservation system. Court reservations can be made up to 7 days in advance of play. Once you have scheduled 4 reservations, the scheduler will not allow you to make another until 7 days from the day you made your first reservation.
14. Reservations must be made at least 1 day in advance of playing in order to be guaranteed. If open times are available then walk on play is permitted.
15. Members have 15 minutes to make their reservation before the court will be declared open.
16. Walk-on players are not guaranteed continued court availability, if a person shows up with proof of their reserved time, but not 15 minutes late, the walk-on players must give up the court immediately to the reserved party.
17. A member may have maximum of 3 guests at one time on the court. A member must be present on court with their guests.
- 18. Special tennis activities such as league play and park tennis socials will be scheduled through Southwest Water Company. Scheduling for these events will not be available online.**

**\* An email address is mandatory to be established with the online reservation system. All reservations will be scheduled by registered members.**

- 3) Golfing within the District's Parks and Greenbelts shall be prohibited.

- 9) All pets must be on leash and under the physical control and restraint by their owners at all times in all parks and greenbelts. Droppings must be removed by the owner.
- 10) No amplified music will be permitted in the District's Parks and Greenbelts without specific, prior Board authorization.
- 11) The District reserves the right to change or impose additional restrictions on use as situations warrant.

an active infestation in the structure.

**Wings:** Another indication is the presence of wings, discarded by swarmers as a normal part of their behavior, found near emergence sites, on window sills or in cobwebs. Infestations also can be detected by the presence of shelter tubes going up the sides of piers, utility entrances or foundation walls.

**Is there any way to prevent infestation?** Many termite problems can be prevented through sound initial designs, mechanical alterations, and sanitation. The first line of prevention is to deny termite's access to food (wood), moisture and shelter. How you maintain your house's landscape can lessen or elevate opportunities for termites to move in.

Mike Merchant, professor and urban entomologist at Texas AgriLife Extension provides this check list:

**Keep wood structures, such as arbors, trellises and decks, from touching the exterior of the house.**

"Termites can come up through a fence and kind of make the bridge between the fence and the house," Merchant says. "Older houses ... tend to have more problems with that."

**Repair leaky exterior spigots, which can invite termites.** "Damp soil is certainly attractive," Merchant says. "If it were soaking-wet soil, they'd probably be repelled by it. It's a little controversial because we want damp soil around the foundation just to keep the slab from heaving and cracking, but overly damp is certainly

not good."

**Ensure soil is properly graded near the foundation.** "You should have 2 to 4 inches of visible slab around your entire house," Merchant says. "Once you bury that brick line, the chance that termites can find a little crack and wheedle their way into the house is pretty high. You need clearance around your house so that once a year, you or a pest-control professional can walk around the outside and check to make sure you don't have any suspicious mud tubes."

**Move woodpiles and other debris away from the house.** "People stack wood next to the house, forgetting that wood on the ground is going to draw termites, and then you've got activity right next to your foundation".

**Infestation Management:** Subterranean termite attacks on houses and other above ground wooden structures begin from the soil level. Chemicals applied to the soil can deter attacks for many years. Termite treatment requires specialized equipment such as drills, pressure injectors, pressure-generating pumps and high-gallon tanks. Therefore, in almost every instance, using the services of professional pest control operators is recommended. They are familiar with construction principles and practices, have the necessary equipment, and know termite biology and habits.

Our next article we will talk about the second wood destroying insect in this series, the Carpenter ant.

## Jewelry Safety

A couple of weeks ago, we had a young lady who brought her approximately 9 year old son in to the station. She stated that they were having a problem getting a ring off his finger and were looking for a little help. We quite regularly have to cut rings off of people due to injuries that cause swelling of the fingers and carry a special "ring cutter" tool just for this occurrence. The interesting part of the story is that this ring was made of a steel alloy that resisted cutting! They had already been to a jeweler the day before and he spent two hours trying to cut through the ring, making it only half way through. We then attempted with our "ring cutter" and went through two of those without scratching it! It seems that the jeweler's tools and our ring cutters are designed for soft metal jewelry (ie. brass, gold, silver, platinum, etc.), not steel.

Obviously, the ring was on too tight, so we couldn't employ a lot of tools that we have at our disposal (power and hand saws, hydraulic tools, pry bars, etc.) due to the fact that we would hurt the finger. To protect the finger, the captain on duty fashioned a protective metal guard that fit between the finger and the ring. Then a

firefighter used a small set of bolt cutters and cut the ring where the jeweler had cut the previous day. This finally cut through the ring but it was still so rigid, we could not bend it to get it off the finger. In the end, we clamped one side of the ring in a bench vice and used a large set of vice-grip pliers to pull the cut parts apart enough to free the finger.

Why did we review this little event? This story is just a friendly reminder that kids have a tendency to grow pretty quickly. If they place any type of rigid jewelry or bracelet around a body part, they may grow past the point of easy removal. If this occurs, hopefully the item is not made out of a material that is extremely resistant to cutting. The serious part of this type of situation is that a restrictive item can reduce or inhibit blood flow to the appendage that it's on and, if prolonged, may cause tissue death.

## Please Don't Feed the Storm Drain

When grass clippings, pet waste, automotive products, fertilizers, pesticides and other chemicals wash down a storm drain, they don't go away. They flow into rivers and lakes, harming plants and animals and contaminating the water we drink. The technical term is "nonpoint source pollution."

Here's how to make sure that you don't help feed the storm drain:

### YARD

Two of our biggest sources of nonpoint source pollution are over-watering and excessive use of fertilizers and pesticides. Here are some tips for reducing nonpoint source pollution from your yard.

- ◆ Do not overfertilize. Sweep (do not wash) fertilizer and soil off driveways and walkways. Use native and adapted plants and grasses that require less water and fertilizer.
- ◆ Leave grass clippings on the lawn to retain moisture and to insulate and nourish the soil.
- ◆ Use nontoxic pest controls.

### AUTO

Each year Texans improperly dump millions of gallons of used motor oil. One quart can pollute 250,000 gallons of drinking water, enough water to supply a family of four for a year! Autos contribute to nonpoint source pollution in other ways, too.

- ◆ Recycle motor oil, filters, fluids and batteries by taking them to service station that has a recycling program or call 1-800-CLEAN-UP for the motor oil recycling center nearest you.
- ◆ Drive less to reduce auto runoff, carpool, consolidate trips or use mass transit whenever possible.

### PETS

Every year thousands of pounds of pet waste wash down storm drains and into rivers, lakes and other sources of drinking water. For your health and the health of others, please pick up after your pet.

- ◆ Pick up pet waste from your lawn. It is not a fertilizer.
- ◆ Encourage friends and family to pick up after their pets using a mutt mitt or plastic, disposable bag and never allow pet waste to wash into storm drains.

### HOME

Although most cleaners, paints and pesticides used at home go into the trash or down the drain, if they are used outside or improperly discarded, they create nonpoint source pollution.

- ◆ Use cleaning products that are phosphate free, biodegradable or nontoxic, especially if they are used outdoors. Avoid products with ammonia, chlorine, diethylene glycol, hydrochloric acid, oxalic acid and petroleum solvents.
- ◆ Discourage insects with good housekeeping. If you must eradicate insects, avoid toxic chemicals or use pest control companies that use less toxic products.

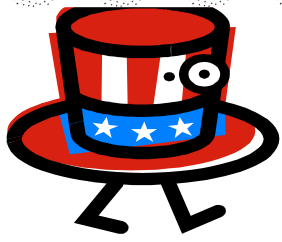

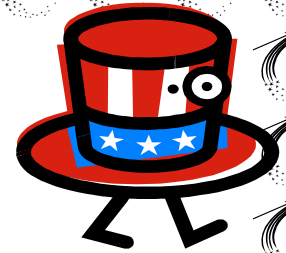
